President Carlsrud called the meeting to order at 2:30 PM.

Agenda Items

Review Monthly Bills/Reports. Finance Director Klein reviewed the monthly bills and reports.

Discuss Task Order Amendment for Environmental Documentation, Design and Bidding for National Guard Water Tower Demolition Project. City Engineer explained that he had spoken with ND DWR and we can request this as part of a project but there is no guarantee that it will be approved. Discussion was had. Consensus was to move this to the Commission Meeting for a vote.

Discuss Changing our Credit Card Issuer. Finance Director Klein stated that by going local, we would receive a 2% cash back as well as other features. The Commissioners agreed to move forward with the change. Effective 7.1.25 we will start using the new cards. Effective 8.1.25 the previous credit cards will be cancelled.

Discuss Completing an Electric Rate Study for Valley City. City Administrator Crawford explained that MRES will pay 50% of the study. This will help determine if our current rates are at the correct price and solidify any increases in the future. The Commissioners agreed to move forward.

Discuss Estimate for 12th St & 9th Ave NW. City Engineer Peterson discussed the origin of the request for funding on extending 12th St from 9th Ave NW into their development. This was roughly three years ago and nothing has taken place since. The Developers were going to ask for an extension but their time has expired. They are now asking for funds again for this project. The baseline costs have gone from 685K to 835K, this will include the revised alignment adding a curve in the road to stay out of the rail road right-a-way and adding sidewalks. Total cost to make this work, would be 1.65M. This could be done in phases. Currently looking into options for cost share funding, No action at this time. This will be removed from the Commission meeting.

Discuss Keeping of Chickens in City Limits. The materials were reviewed and discussion was had. The preference of the Commissioners was to consider the request, but will make no changes at this time.

Discuss Overpayment of Snow Disaster Funds from the State. Finance Director explained the error made at the State level and we will be paying back the overage. This was just an FYI.

Discuss Sale of Easement on Farm Land near City Lagoon. City Attorney Martineck talked about the new Inter-operable Radio Tower System that the State has been working on for a few years. This location is the best option for the Tower by Valley City. Allo offered 10K for the easement. Allo will also reach

out to the Farmer renting and pay for his crop loss. Commission consensus is agreeable to move forward with this process.

Department Reports

Department Spotlight – Street Department – Part 2

Sanitation Department Supervisor Swart reported on the Electronics Clean-Up weeks. The Residents appreciate us for providing that service. Letters were sent out to certain Residents for some of the remaining items on boulevards that are not picked up by the Crew. The 2020 Peterbilt will have the tag axle put on in Fargo at NW Truck & Trailer who had the lowest bid.

Water Department Water Supervisor Hesch updated the Commissioners on the Low-Level Alarm that alerted him. He had some Divers from the Valley City Fire Department clean the intake screen and they moved the sensor out of the silt and the Alarm ended. Due to the rain, the water usage has been down.

Electrical Department Electrical Superintendent Senf talked about the one outage from last month. The Columbia Grain project was completed. He is looking to order the fiber now for the Service Center due to it being on hand and a good price. Keeping an eye on the soft costs for the project. The plan is to be done boring the south side of town this week.

Fire Department Fire Chief Magnuson reported on the calls for service for the past month and on the blighted buildings around town. He gave updates on the listed locations.

Police Department Police Chief Horner went over the Calls for Service for the past month. He shared the Trainings and Community events that He and the Officers have been attending. Received funding with City/County Health & CHI Mercy to supply CISM Training for up to 25 Officers and First Responders and then open it up to Residents.

Street Department Operations Supervisor Klemisch talked about the annual inspection from the Department of Agriculture & we passed. Doing a great job of record keeping but will need to start advertising the spraying by means of social media to inform the Residents. Capped the old water service at the Valley Plains site, the street patching was us. Hot mixing around town, spraying for weeds and one spraying for mosquitoes is done.

Administration

City Administer Crawford reported that the New Service Center Ground Work has begun. Update meetings will be held weekly. They are moving right along, they have however run into quite a bit of cement chunks. We are working to see if the City can haul that out to save on the costs. Cost estimates will be taken care of by Gwen & Brenda.

Finance Director Klein reported that she is working on the current Audit and the 2026 Budget.

NEW BUSINESS

2025 Summer Storm Update:

Mayor Dave Carlsrud called the meeting to order. He then shared a few words of Thanks and blessings for all who were affected by the storms last Friday night.

City Administrator Crawford continued the Meeting/Press Conference sharing that Valley City experienced a very severe and fast-moving couple of storms that resulted in significant damage throughout our community. Our Crews, with support from Emergency Responders, have been working around the clock to restore power, clear debris and insure safety. Thank you for your dedication and to the Residents for your patience.

Electrical Superintendent Senf shared that Residents of Valley City were out of power from ½ hour to a handful still out today. Those remaining without power do need a certified Electrician to repair the wiring and then Public Works should be able to turn their power on. There are lines still down, if a downed line or trees on a line are noticed, you are asked to call into Public Works to report it. There are 16 known, broken poles as of right now. If you have not done so and you do not have power, please call in to report it.

Street Department Operations Supervisor Klemisch reported that his Crew has been concentrating on clearing debris and branches/trees from roadways. They will start alleys as soon as possible. The Transfer Station has received a Burn Permit and have already started trying to burn some of the piles that have been hauled out. Reminder that the 24/7 You Haul Area is open. His crew did clear out quite a bit today to make more room. If you find an extra Garbage Container, please call into Public Works with the serial number to report it so we can get it to the right home. For those who are not able to haul your trees and branches out to the Transfer Station, Crews will be going around and picking them up. They should be on your boulevard stacked and ready for the grapple forks to grab. We are still planning on the branch pickup on July 24th for any remaining branches.

Sara Miller with Barnes County Dispatch gave a summary of the storm and the notices from Friday evening. She reported that they answered 1386 calls, 103 911 calls, 538 for service throughout the weekend. They took 214 calls for power outages after the storm for Valley City. Her team did an amazing job and took calls for several other agencies throughout the weekend. Keeping the agencies alerted at all times. If you are having a hard time dealing with the aftermath of the storm, please do not suffer alone. Call or text 988 or 911. Someone will answer and be able to talk to you.

Fire Chief Scott Magnuson explained how his team and other agencies covered a grid search from Highway 1 to Fingal. Every farmstead in the path of the tornado was checked for possible injured or trapped residents. They did assist in two rescues. Thank you to MDU for assisting the Fire Department with gas leaks in the area.

Jessica Jenrich, Barnes County Emergency Manager, updated all on the two National Weather Service's confirmed tornados as well as the high winds. She reiterated the 988-hotline number as we mentally recover from these storms. The Red Cross will also help with assistance including food, tangible items and lodging.

City Administrator Crawford sent out a sincere to the City Staff, Fire Department & Police Department who went above and beyond to help get through this weekend. The number of hours that were spent making sure that everyone is OK and then clearing trees and debris to get the roads open. The Electrical Department for getting power back on as soon as possible to the residents. Making our residents the number one priority.



1925 100 years ago Sanborn teacher drowns while at Chautauqua Park

Miss Florence Bennett, 20 of Lidgerwood, N. Dakota., lost her life by drowning in the Sheyenne river at Chautauqua Park shortly after two o'clock this afternoon. Miss Bennett, a teacher at Sanborn, was here with other teachers and pupils of the school, who gathered at the park today to enjoy a school picnic. Miss Clara Gottenberg, another teacher, and Miss Elizabeth Malm, 19, entered the river at the boy's swimming hole and, finding it too deep there, entered at a more shallow place. Miss Gottenberg at

first was seized with cramps and Miss Bennett is said to have gone to her rescue. Both girls were out beyond a wire fencing in the river. Miss Malm

succeeded in reaching shore and Walter Hoster, Jr., of Valley City, bathing nearby, jumped into the water and saved Miss Gottenberg, but was not aware at the time that Miss Bennett was under. RESOLUTION NO. 2496

A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT AND EXTEND THE DECLARATION OF STORM DISASTER DATED JUNE 21, 2025

WHEREAS, the City of Valley City experienced serious thunderstorms beginning on the evening of June 20, 2025, with bands of heavy rain, hail, lighting, and sustained winds in excess of 100 miles per hour continuing through the early morning of June 21, which caused significant damage throughout the entire city; and

WHEREAS, said damage, including downed trees, power poles and power lines, and loss of power provided by the Valley City Electric Department, and damage to other public and private property, has overwhelmed City services; and

WHEREAS, the nature of the storm and resulting damage is unprecedented; disaster preparation was not possible; and the costs of disaster mitigation are expected to substantially exceed amounts appropriated by the City for debris clean-up and emergency maintenance and repair of electric infrastructure and other property; and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2025, President Dave Carlsrud declared a storm disaster pursuant to section 19-01-03(1) of the Valley City Municipal Code (V.C.M.C.); and

WHEREAS, on June 21, 2025, North Dakota Governor Kelly Armstrong issued Executive Order 2025-05, declaring a statewide disaster as a result of severe summer storms and tornados; and

WHEREAS, the Board of City Commissioners wishes to extend the City's storm disaster declaration, pursuant to V.C.M.C. § 19-01-03(3), to ensure adequate time for the response and recovery aspects of any and all applicable local disaster or emergency operational plans and for the furnishing of aid and assistance thereunder.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Board of City Commissioners formally recognizes and adopts the Declaration of Storm Disaster dated June 21, 2025; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that local efforts shall continue to be coordinated with appropriate county, state and federal departments, agencies and officials to take all appropriate action to properly and effectively respond to and mitigate the storm disaster.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that exempt employees designated by the City Administrator are eligible for and authorized to receive payment of overtime during the declared storm disaster.

This emergency declaration shall remain in effect until August 20, 2025, unless extended upon approval of the Board of Commissioners, or otherwise rescinded.

The following change is requested to reflect current policy regarding pay for law enforcement officers working special events.

- 4. Employees will not accept outside employment or volunteer the employee's services if such work requires the use of City equipment, facilities, uniforms or materials.
- 5. Licensed peace officers in the Police Department may work special events for outside organizations in their capacity as law enforcement officers but at all times must comply with existing city and department policies and will be paid by the City. Non-exempt officers are entitled to their regular pay, including applicable overtime. Exempt officers will be paid \$50 per hour. Special events must be offered to non-exempt officers before exempt officers are eligible. The Police Department should have a policy to ensure the city is reimbursed and insured by the outside organization to cover the Department's expenses. The rate for special events will be listed in the City Master Fee Schedule upon resolution of the Board of City Commissioners, after considering the Police Chief's recommendation. Outside of approved special event work, law enforcement personnel are subject to paragraph 4 of this section.

The purpose of this exhibit is to describe the scope of work and responsibilities required to complete Construction Engineering services for the proposed project. KLJ will provide Project Management and Construction Engineering work for the proposed project.

5.1 CONSTRUCTION ADMINISTRATION

Project Management

KLJ will manage the project and provide overall coordination of the work completed by the construction engineering team. The work shall consist of managing work assignments, internal team and safety meetings, client coordination, plan and specification interpretation, certification and shop drawing review, administering requests for information from the Contractor, processing routine change orders, and monitoring KLJ's project budget and schedule.

Project Initiation

This task includes time for the construction staff to review plans, set up the record keeping system and create a work plan.

Pre-Construction Conference

The Project Engineer, Project Manager, and other key staff will prepare for and conduct the preconstruction conference. Minutes of the pre-construction conference will be prepared and distributed by KLJ.

Weekly Records

Contract administration and project documentation will be according to established NDDOT construction procedures, as outline in the Construction Records Manual. Major tasks include daily diary entries, weekly progress reports, certification tracking, quantity entries, pay estimates, and minor change orders. If required the adding of major change orders, including force accounts that are beyond the scope of the original contract, will be executed through supplemental agreements.

Final Review

The Project Engineer and/or the Project Manager will conduct a final review with the Contractor, Valley City and NDDOT.



Final Records

Final records will include verifying all quantities for accuracy, completing all necessary final document forms listed on the NDDOT Final Checklist, completing record drawings, and packaging and filing final documents.

5.2 REMOVALS & EARTHWORK

KLJ will provide daily field observation and quantity documentation for the following items:

- a. Removals
 - i. Removal of Curb & Gutter
- b. Earthwork
 - i. Common Excavation Waste
 - ii. Subgrade Preparation-Type A
- c. Landscaping
 - i. Topsoil
 - ii. Seeding Class III
 - iii. Hydraulic Mulch

5.3 BASES

Aggregate Base Course CL 5

KLJ will provide daily field observation, sampling and testing of materials, quantity documentation, and field survey for Aggregate Base Course work.

5.4 MISCELLANEOUS CONSTRUCTION

Construction Traffic Control

KLJ will review the Contractor's work twice daily during construction to verify conformance with the plans and specifications. This will involve communication and coordination with the Contractor, Subcontractors, and Valley City. The Contractor is responsible for safety within the work zone and to the traveling public. KLJ will provide quantity documentation for traffic control items.

Erosion Control

KLJ will provide daily field observation and quantity documentation for erosion control related items as well as monitor Contractor's SWPPP.

Concrete

KLJ will provide daily field observation, sampling of materials and quantity documentation for concrete related items including curb & gutter and sidewalks. KLJ will also provide field survey staking for these items.

Signing & Pavement Marking

KLJ will provide daily field observation, quantity documentation, and field survey for signing and pavement marking items.



5.5 MATERIALS TESTING

Aggregate Testing

KLJ will complete testing of aggregates according to the NDDOT Field Sampling and Testing Manual and the NDDOT 2024 Standard Specifications.

Concrete Testing

KLJ will complete field testing of concrete and concrete aggregates according to the NDDOT Field Sampling and Testing Manual and the NDDOT 2024 Standard Specifications.

Density Testing

KLJ will complete density testing according to the NDDOT Field Sampling and Testing Manual and the NDDOT 2024 Standard Specifications.


